### SYNOPSIS

Christian W. Biggs was administered a polygraph examination to determine whether or not his father, Jeremy Biggs, had ever touched Christian in a sexual manner; whether Christian was ever made to touch his father in a sexual manner; and whether Christian had ever witnessed his father touch any other child in a sexual manner. Christian has recently stated that none of the three above actions ever occurred. The subsequent polygraph examination reflected no deception concerning these issues, indicating that he is being truthful when stating the above described acts never happened.

### DETAILS

During the early to mid 1990's, Christian W. Biggs alleged that his father, Jeremy Biggs, had sexually molested him. At the time, Christian was approximately 11 years old. The case eventually went to trial at the Superior Court of Cobb County, Georgia, where Christian provided testimony that his father sexually molested him. Jeremy was subsequently convicted and incarcerated.

More recently, Christian has recanted his testimony and adamantly denies that his father ever sexually molested him. Furthermore, Christian states that he has no personal knowledge whatsoever of his father ever molesting any child. Due to this new information, Attorney Aimee R. Maxwell of the Georgia Innocence Project has agreed to review the case. In an effort to ascertain if Christian is now being truthful, Christian volunteered to submit to a polygraph examination.

## POLYGRAPH EXAMINATION PROCESS

NOTE: The polygraph examination process was video recorded.

On Monday, September 26, 2005 at approximately 9:00AM, Certified Forensic Polygraph Examiner Donald J. Imbordino met with Christian W. Biggs at Mr. Imbordino's office located at 125 TownPark Drive, Kennesaw, GA. The purpose of this meeting was so Mr. Imbordino could administer a polygraph examination to Christian. However, the polygraph examination process had to be terminated on this day before the process could be completed as explained below.

*Christian stated that he was experiencing heart-burn and could be seen frequently expelling air/gas from his abdomen. Christian said that prior to arriving for the polygraph he ate a greasy steak sandwich and a carbonated drink for breakfast and that the meal was not settling well with him. Mr. Imbordino provided Christian with some antacids in an effort to correct this problem. However, after about 30 minutes the problem persisted.*

*The polygraph examination process was terminated on this day just prior to the point where Mr. Imbordino explains the polygraph instrumentation to the examinee. The decision to terminate the polygraph at this time was thought to be prudent in order to prevent inaccurate examination results caused by Christian's case of heart-burn. The examination was rescheduled for Friday, September 30, 2005 at 12:00PM.*

The following is a cumulative description of the polygraph examination administered to Christian over the two day period.

During the polygraph examination process Christian acknowledged that he was present under his own free will and said that he wanted to prove the truth and set the record straight about his father, Jeremy Biggs. Christian clarified this by emphatically stating that his father never touched him in a sexual manner or any other child that he is aware of. Christian added that he provided false testimony at his father's trial because he believed his father had abandoned him by divorcing his mother, Leah.

While conducting the polygraph examination pretest interview, Mr. Imbordino thoroughly discussed with Christian, for clarification purposes, the ways in which a parent could possibly touch a child in an inappropriate sexual manner. These acts are considered to be illegal and not morally or socially acceptable.

- Inappropriate Touching: Defined as fondling the pelvic area, buttocks or the breasts of a child. Inappropriate touching would also include the placing of the child's hands on the adult's sex organs or the rubbing of the adult's sex organs upon the body of the child. It was further explained that inappropriate touching *did not* include parental duties such as bathing a child or changing diapers.
- Inappropriate Oral Contact: Defined as the placing of the adult's mouth to the pelvic area, buttocks or breasts of the child. Inappropriate oral contact would also include placing the child's mouth to the sex organs of the adult parent.

Christian advised that he clearly understood the ways in which an adult could touch a child in an inappropriate sexual manner. He again assured Mr. Imbordino that at no time did his father ever do any of those things to him nor did he ever witness his father ever do those things to any other child.

Mr. Imbordino felt confident that Christian did in fact understand all of the above considerations. Mr. Imbordino further explained to Christian that the term "sexual manner" when used in the following polygraph examination questions involved all of the above descriptions.

The following relevant questions were asked during the polygraph examination series utilizing the Air Force Modified General Question Test. This is a commonly used and validated testing format used by the federal government. Furthermore, all procedures were performed in accordance with established federal government standards and the standards set forth by the American Polygraph Association and the American Association of Police Polygraphists. Also, noted below is Christian's answer to each question and Mr. Imbordino's opinion concerning Christian's veracity relative to these issues.

## Relevant Polygraph Questions

1. HAS YOUR FATHER EVER TOUCHED YOU IN A SEXUAL MANNER?  
Answer: No.
2. HAS YOUR FATHER EVER MADE YOU TOUCH HIM IN A SEXUAL MANNER?  
Answer: No.
3. HAVE YOU EVER WITNESSED YOUR FATHER TOUCH ANY CHILD IN A SEXUAL MANNER?  
Answer: No.

**Opinion:** No Deception Indicated. Based on the analysis of the charts collected, the physiological responses did not indicate deception when answering relevant questions concerning this matter. – Truthful.

It must be noted that after the administration of Chart One, Christian reported to Mr. Imbordino that the noise outside the polygraph examination room bothered him quite a bit during the exam. Mr. Imbordino agreed that the noise was very apparent as people could be heard talking and opening and closing doors. In the interest of fairness and in an effort to obtain accurate results, Mr. Imbordino decided to not utilize Chart One for analysis because there would be no way to ascertain if any reaction noted was due to the act of deception or a result of the apparent noise that could be heard. In other words, this chart has no diagnostic value. To not utilize this chart for evaluation is consistent with polygraph standards of practice for the reason stated herein. Therefore, a fourth chart was obtained. - Charts 2, 3 & 4 were used for analysis.

**Instrumentation:** The polygraph instrumentation utilized to collect and record Christian's physiological responses during the above described polygraph examination was the Axciton Computerized Polygraph System.

The polygraph examination process was terminated at approximately 2:15PM on September 30, 2005. The computerized polygraph data, question sheet and all official notes and documents will be retained by Imbordino Polygraph Examinations, LLC.
